

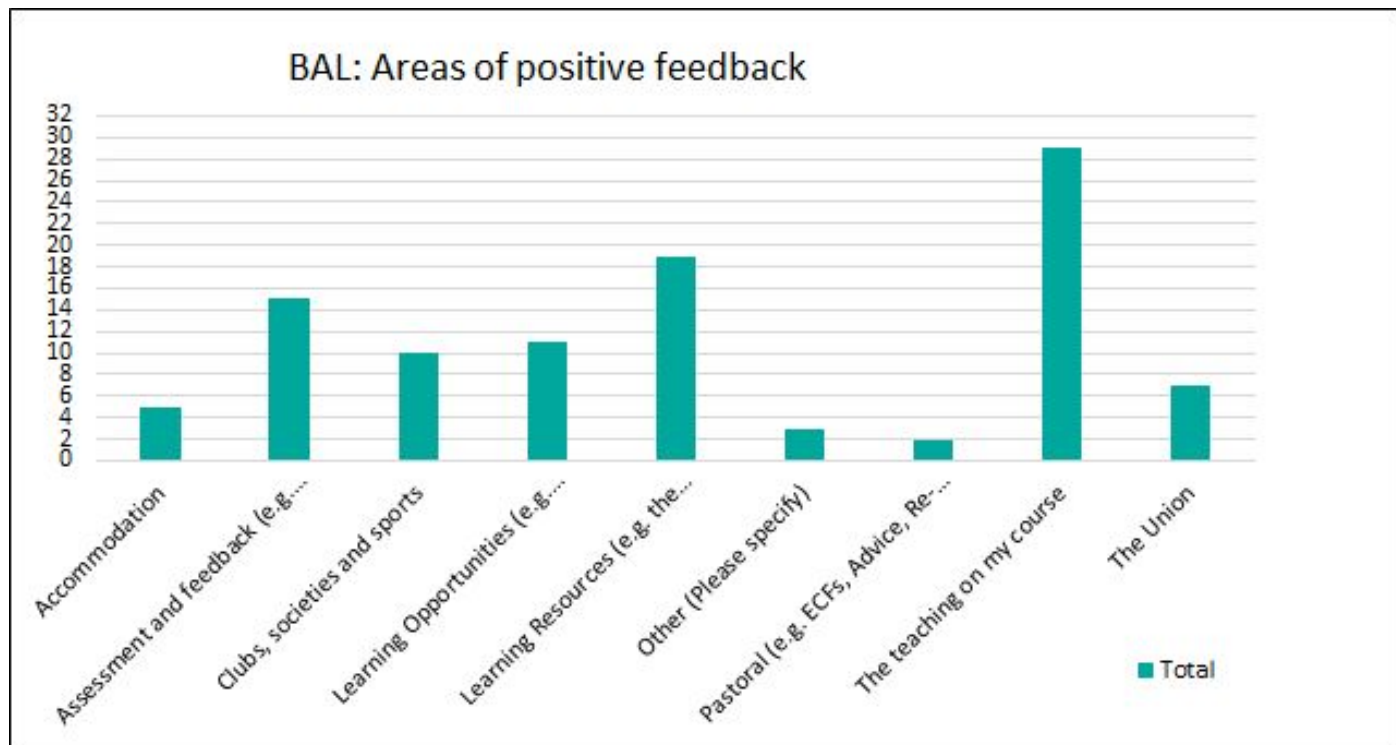

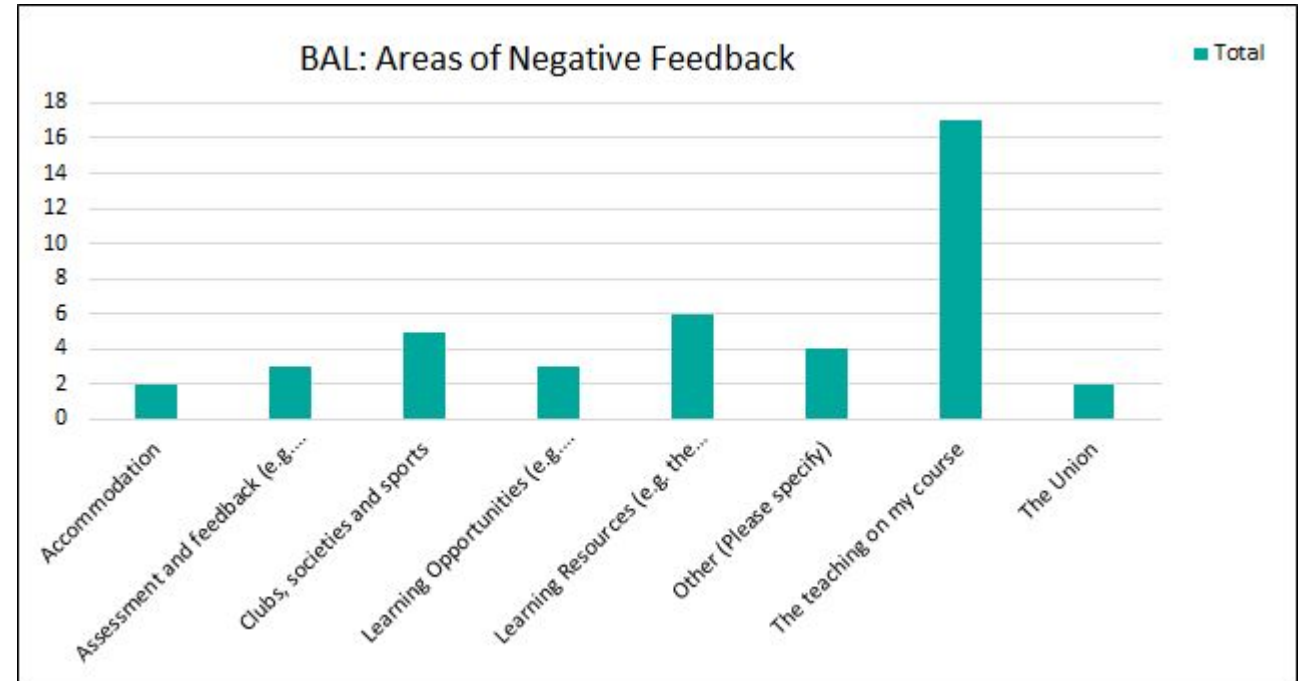


POSITIVE FEEDBACK

- The opportunity to undertake a placement is great

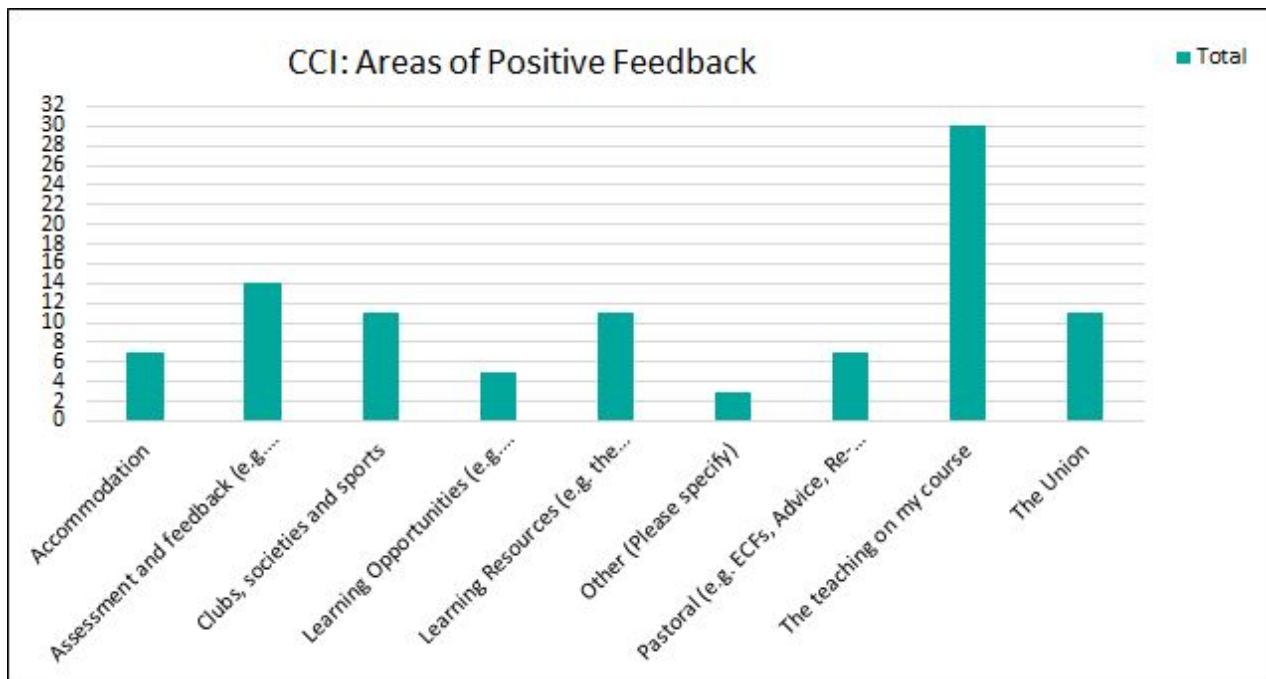
AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT

CREATIVE AND CULTURAL INDUSTRIES

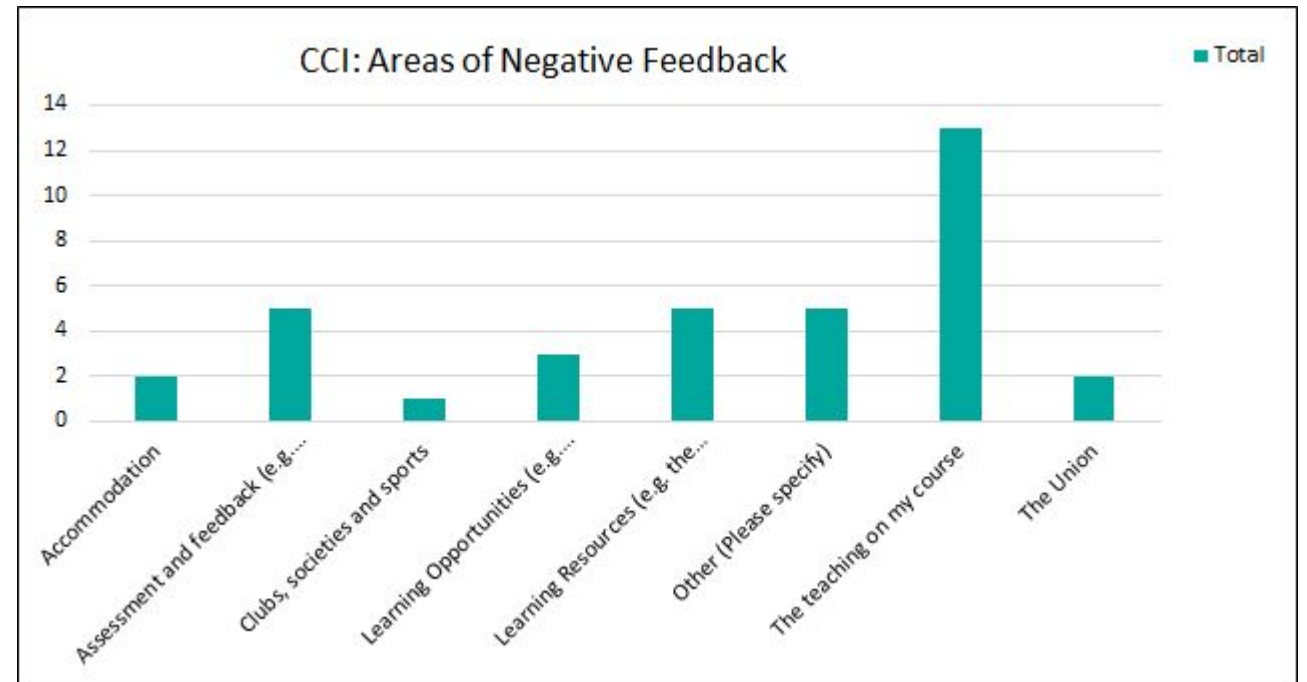


POSITIVES

- Technicians across the faculty are approachable

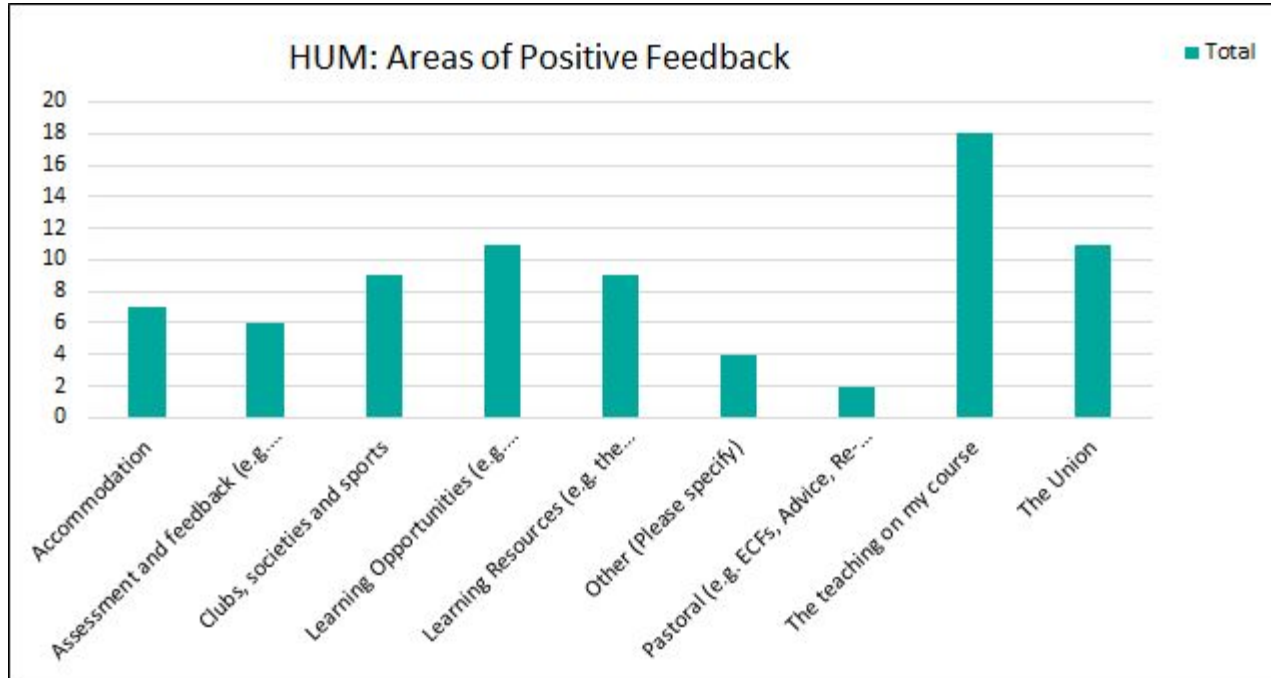
AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT

Humanities and Social Sciences

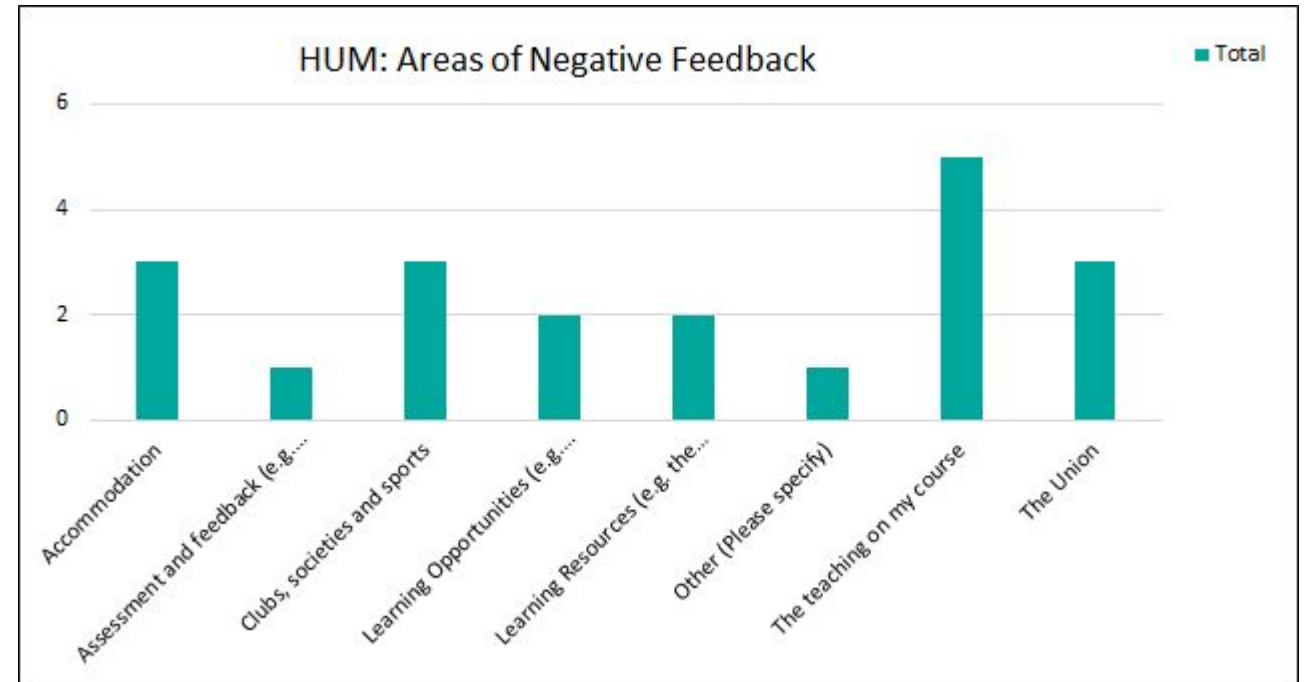


POSITIVES

AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT

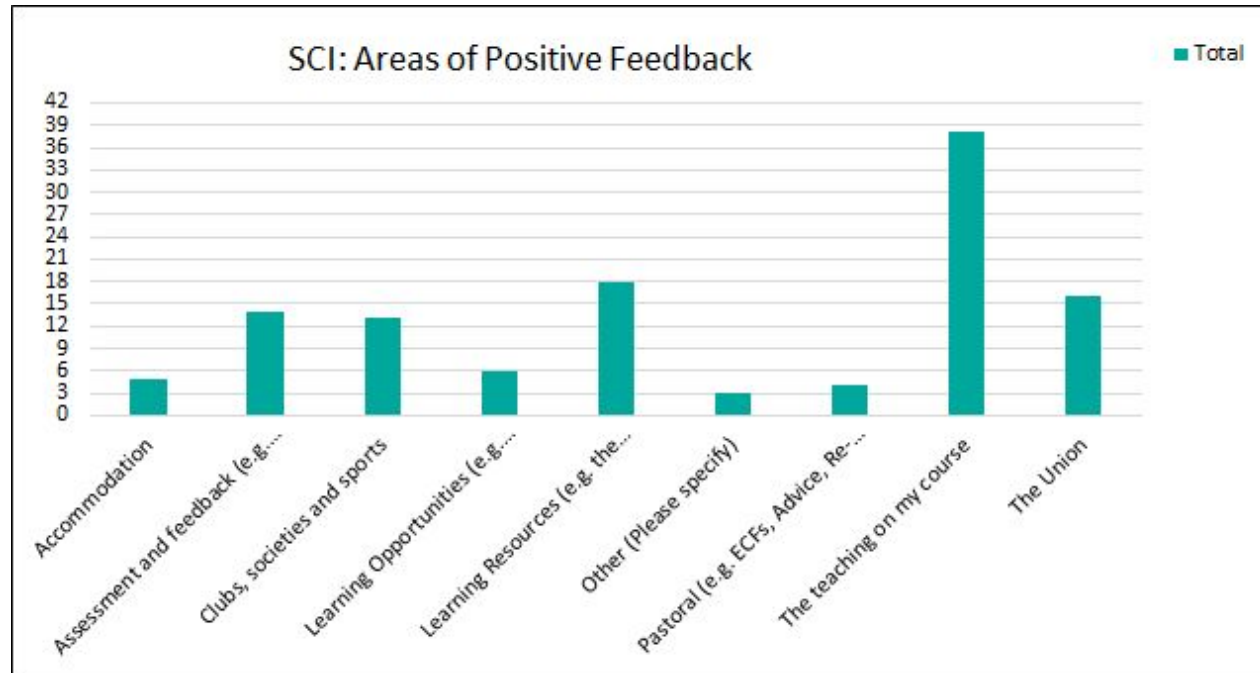
- Assignments could be more spread out and not as bunched up.

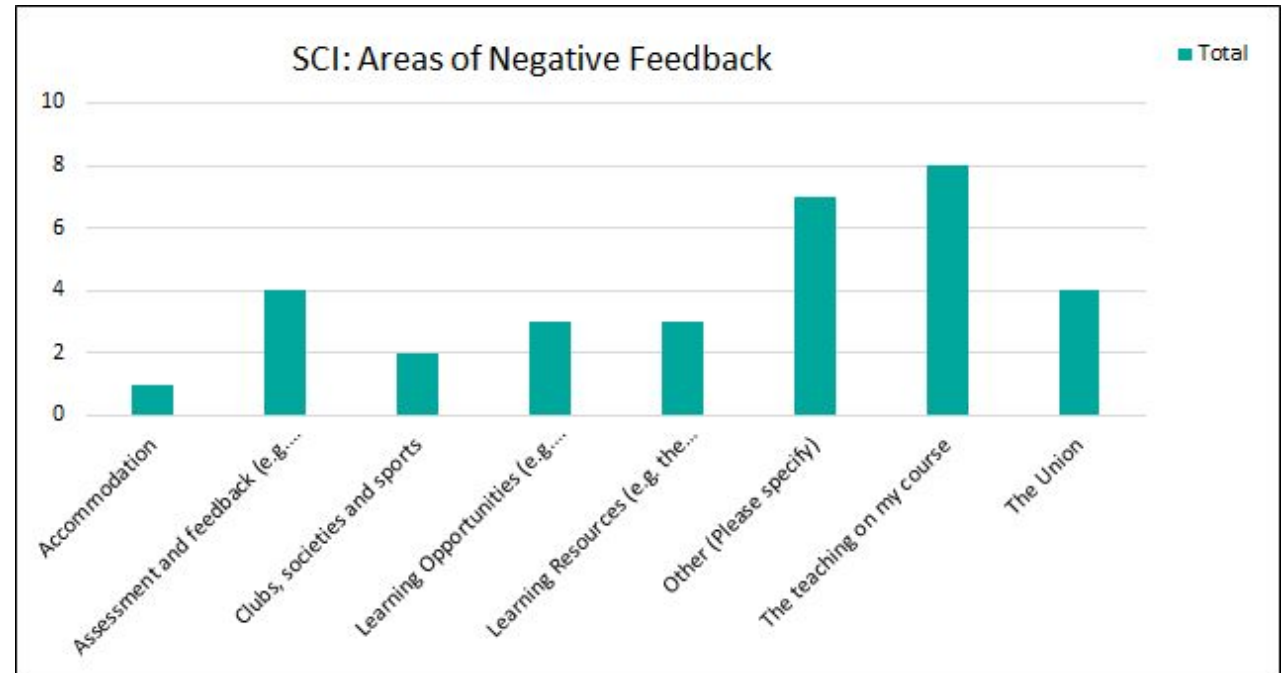


POSITIVES

- Course representatives are engaged and proactive.

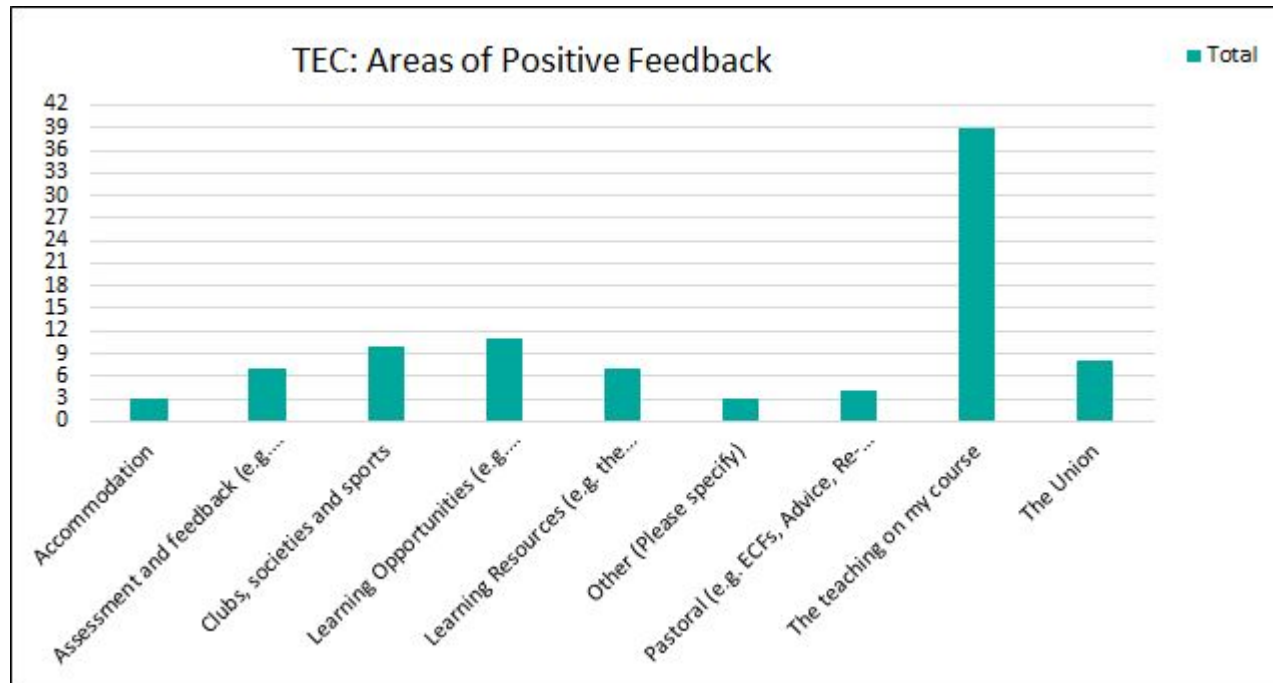
AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT
